Note:-

- Whenever 'J' letter needs sukoon ~~it~~ it splits up.
- Whenever 'J' letter needs no sukoon then there will be shaddha.

eg.

Present (Active) ← يُحِبُّ

Present (Passive) ← يُحِبُّ
(oo aa sound)

The above is not a small family b'cz only 3 big families has 'ج' in the beginning in Present tense.

like:-

يُعَلِّمُ

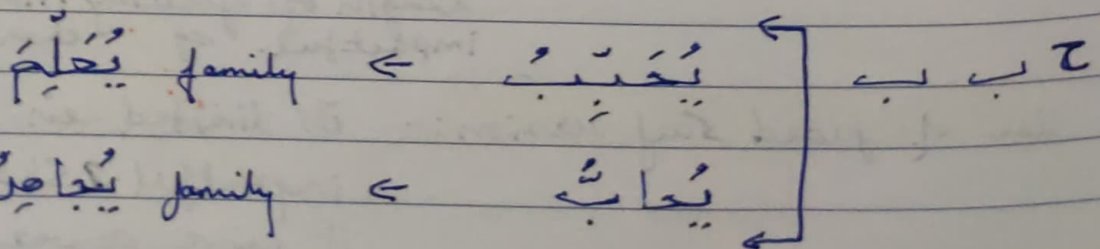
يُنْتَبِهُ

• it has alif before last 2 letters

• shaddha before the last letter

∴ the above ^{يُعِبُّ} word belongs to أَشْبَه family

Basically: يُعَبِّبُ → ^{becomes} يُعِدُّ → يُعِدُّ (Kasrah is carried over)



- The only weird word which is acting normal -
Let's see in the example below:-

Present Tense Chart:-

have shadda & cant تُحِبُّونَ تُحِبُّونَ تُحِبُّونَ

sukoon so it has to split. **تُحِبُّنَ** تُحِبُّونَ تُحِبُّونَ

أُحِبُّ أُحِبُّ

- In the lightest form of Mudaa' it also needs sukoon, so 2 letters split up.

eg. Lightest Light Normal

Big family → **يُحِبُّنَ** يُحِبُّونَ يُحِبُّونَ

Small family → **يُحِبُّنَ** يُحِبُّونَ يُحِبُّونَ

Whenever the Laam letter i.e the last root letter needs a sukoon, then we have to split into two letters

أَنْتَ نَعَزْتِ

Normal **يُحِبُّ**

Light **يُحِبَّ**

Lightest **يُحِبْ** SUKoon & shadda can't co-exist

فَرَّ يَفِرُّ

• Yaa followed by three letters so six small families

• sounds closer to يَفِرُّ

• Light version → **يَفِرُّ**

• Lightest version → **يَفِرْ**
